Objectives

- To gain a view of Women's competitive golf in the UK, from women who regularly participate in competitive golf
- To provide an insight into the age and handicap ranges of women who participate in competitive golf
- To provide an insight in to the competitions women golfers participate in
- To provide an insight into women's view of women's competitive golf in the UK
- To identify the format of competitions women would like to participate in
- To establish if there is a gap in what is available for competitive women golfers
- To find out if women are interested in a National Golf League

Methodology

- Develop a survey to find out what competitions women play in and the ones they are interested in playing in
- Within the survey ask open questions to gain an insight about women's view of women's competitive golf
- Introduce the online survey to 3 groups of women golfers:
 - A group of women who have recently participated in a national 2 day competition (52 responses)
 - A group of women golfers, who have participated in a Ladies Pro-Am and have (136 responses)
 - A group of women on Twitter and Facebook (128 responses)
- Analyse the responses to provide an insight to women's competitive golf
- Identify gaps in the women's competitive golf experience
- Make recommendations which address gaps

Group	Survey Responses	Community Description
Social	128	A couple of tweets were sent out on Twitter, asking for people to fill in the survey and for it to be retweeted. It was retweeted 4 times.
LPA & GG	136	A mailing list of women golfers, made from attendees of a ladies pro-am event and customers from a small women's golf product website (approximately 400 women golfers)
Brenda King Foursomes Participant's	154	Group of senior women, 50 and over, golfers who participated in a 2 day foursomes competition on 1^{st} & 2^{nd} October., and members of a senior, Vets, golfers association.

Observations

- Women golfers participate in and are interested in competitive golf
- Competitive women golfers, who responded to the survey, are members of golf clubs.
- Women golfers are interested in competing in 1 day and multi-day individual competitions.
- Women golfers are interested in competing in 1 day and multi-day individual competitions.

- Women golfers are interested in participating in local, regional and national competitions.
- Women golfers are interested in competing in various competition formats in Age and Handicap ranges
- Women golfers are interested in a National League for women golfers.


There is an opportunity to create more competitive events for women golfers, of all ages and handicap ranges, across the UK.


Women Golfer Demographics






Almost all respondents to the survey are member's of a golf club.


Women and girls of all ages participate in competitive golf.

Women Golfers Club Compeition Participation




Competitive women golfers participate in a range of competitions formats, both as an individual as well as being part of a team.

Many competitions are held mon-fri, which excludes women golfers who work.


Qualitative research shows that women would like more weekend competitions.

Women Golfers COUNTY Compeition Participation









Competitive senior, 50 and over, women golfers participate in a range of competitions formats, both as an individual as well as being part of a team.

Many competitions are held Mon-Fri, therefore seniors are more likely to be available to play due to less family and work commitments, therefore are more likely to play in mid-week events.









Individual Formats for all Age Groups




Competitive women golfers are interested in participating in a wide range of individual competitions, locally, regionally and nationally.
