


Joining a Golf Club – what will my experience be?

There are 2 types of potential new golf club members:

New To Golf

Experience Golfer

New to Golf members may come from a sporting background or golf may be the first sport they have participated in. Today, it is more likely that the new member will have been introduced to the idea of learning to play golf and joining a club, through their family, partner, children or friends, who are existing golfers and members of a club. It is less likely they will be an individual who takes up golf without a connection.



Both groups want to learn more about the club, what is on offer and what the application process is.

The biggest challenge for any potential member is finding out what a golf club offers

The Womens' Golf Experience

The women's golf experience is currently individual golf club focused, created and managed by existing women golfers, within the access to club and course facilities granted by their club. As volunteers, they are likely to have limited skills to be able to develop and evolve the golfers experience beyond their personal experience. Women golfers do the best they can within the limitations of their experience and skills.

Golf clubs are not transparent about the golf experience offered by their club.

- Women golfers create, maintain & defend their individual, club, county, national, golf associations & society golf experience.
- The women's golf experience is created within the CONSTRAINTS imposed by men, women, tradition, club & county culture and the ACCESS to courses and club facilities GRANTED to them.
- The women's golf experience is
 - focused on women who play Monday Friday
 - PREDOMINATLY club focused and based on club traditions, some are moving to being more forward looking
 - delivered by self-regulating committees
 - Committees are unlikely to have the SKILLS to develop the golf experience or MANAGE & embrace CHANGE taking place in golf.

- Women golfers volunteer their time to support golf in their clubs, counties and at national and international events.
 - Golf volunteers are self-selecting and self-regulating, with little or no accountability.
 - Volunteer Roles include:
 - Club and County Committees
 - Team Captains and Organisers
 - Event volunteers, marshals
 - Self organising Associations and Alliances
 - No training and skills development for volunteer roles in golf, little or no accountability, no people management

There is limited engagement across all areas of golf clubs to create and develop a rounded golfers experience.

Benefits of Golf Club Membership for EXISITING Women Golfers

Golf club membership, volunteering and participation provides a lot of benefits to all golfers, however, existing women golfers in particular benefit from a sense of purpose and belonging as well as providing an outlet for their competitive nature and an opportunity to participate at a level they aspire to and are capable of.

- Golf provides regular contact and engagement with a community of women similar to themselves Mon-fri.
- Women's golf days comps, practice and roll ups, similar to men, provide set days and times in a week where they can catch up with other like minded women with similar backgrounds/profiles, lifestyles and interests.
- Golf participation provides a weekly, monthly and annual structure similar to the structure work and other regular activities provide.
 - ALL Golfers benefit from regular activities offered by Golf Clubs.
 - All golfers benefit from a "sense of belonging" and the familiarity of regular socialising around a common interest.

Volunteer Roles provide:

- Status, Identity, Purpose, Recognition, feelings of being valued, contributing to something beyond their home life.
- Self-confidence, fulfilment and position outside of their home life.
- Respect from and identity within a community of likeminded women from a similar background.
- Use their skills, build knowledge and get satisfaction from participating in, supporting and organising events



Benefits of PARTICIPATION for EXISITING Women Golfers

Golf participation offers a number of benefits



- Competitive sporting opportunities
- An opportunity to progress in and improve skills in a sport throughout your life
- The opportunity to participate in social activities on and off the course
- The opportunity to play a sport at an individual, team, club, county and national level
- Opportunities to meet and play with other women through club, county, association and society golf events
- Regular social contact through weekly, monthly annual events (many golfers book their golf weeks, months and a year or more in advance and plan their other activities around their golf diary)
- Regular exercise in the fresh air, with other people, good for health and well being
- Access to like-minded people with similar backgrounds, local to their home (many golfers live within 5-15 mins drive from their club, others drive a distance to find like-minded people)
- Women golfers welcome others similar to themselves

Golf Participation Provides

Challenges INTEGRATING new golfers

The golf industry has carried out a range of market research into the value of attracting women to start their golf journey and increase their levels of participation in golf across multiple formats and club and on course pathways. As players evolve their skills and become more familiar with the opportunities to play golf on courses and as members of golf clubs, the role of integrating new players in to golf clubs rests with Golf Club Management teams and volunteer committees, many of who will have members with very different views and desires for their clubs current and future golf club member experience.

Golf is undergoing a fast paced period of transformation, driven by National Governing Bodies initiatives and new technology driven entrants to the golf experience market place. The current individuals and committees within golf clubs and committees do not have the skills and experience to manage transformation at the rate the industry is being pushed to change and this is and will continue to be a challenge to integrating new golfers into clubs and to increasing participation.

Golfers are for the most part over 55 and are not generally open to much change in their life and in particular their golf experience, so are and will resist change.

	•	New Golfers come from varied backgrounds, ages and life experiences and lifestyles
	•	Existing Golfers come from a similar backgrounds, which are generally different to new golfers
New Golfer	•	New golfers are being attracted by initiatives created by national governing bodies and other groups, without providing mechanisms for existing club members to easily integrate and provide pathways based on expectations being created.
Integration Challenges	•	Women golfers, especially long-term golfers, have a golf experience which they feel they have to protect and will resist new ideas and new people, if they feel that this will risk the status quo.
Chanenges	•	Club golfers do not have the skills to create and develop new golf experiences and mostly do not have any interest in doing so.
	•	Existing golfers are wary of new people and new ideas and will reject ideas and exclude individuals.



Women pioneers in amateur golf 1893-2022 - UK

The tradition of women coming together to create their own experiences, continues today, with new groups of women golfers coming together online and offline to create more playing opportunities and find like minded golfers to play with of all ages and abilities.

In the last few years, 8 women have setup groups aimed at women golfers, similar to themselves, in order to facilitate a broader golf experience for women.

Women Golf Experience - Associations, Alliances and Societies

Outside of Golf Clubs and county associations, there are 3 other forms of women's golf groups:

- Womens Golf Alliances regional groups of women who participate in leagues within and across county borders
- Veteran Ladies Golf Associations for women 50 and over, founded in 2021, split in to Scotland, North, Midland and South Associations in 1969.
- Individual Golf Societies setup and run by groups of friends or like minded golfers from one or more golf clubs

Many women's golf groups are invitation only, to ensure that like minded women who fit in with current members join the group.
